



- Soft pencil**
(to draw your design on the fabrics)
- Spoon, salt and vinegar**
(you have to check out the instructions for your dye)
- Wooden spoon or little stock, rubber gloves, plastic apron or old cloth**
(for making the dye bath)
- Plastic bowl or bucket**
(for dyeing)
- Fabrics, T-Shirt or something else**
(the fabric you want to use)
- Suitable compact Batik Frame or wooden picture frame**
(to stretch the fabric)
- Pins or tacks**
(for attaching fabric to a frame)
- Batik wax or white candles**
- Batik wax pot or an empty can and pot**
(for melting the wax)
- Paint brushes of various sizes, Tjanting or other equipments**
(to draw the design onto the fabric)
- Textile Dyes**
(for dyeing the fabrics)



- Clotheshorse and -clips**
(to hang up the wet dyed batiks)

- Absorbent paper or old newspapers**
(to off-press and absorp the wax)

- Old household iron, ironing board**
(to off-press the wax)
